



Rev. Anthony Chiaramonte

January 20, 1938 - October 16, 2022

Albany – Our brother, Rev. Anthony J. Chiaramonte, passed into eternal life suddenly at his home on October 16, 2022. He was born on January 20, 1938, in Albany to Joseph and Elizabeth Chiaramonte. He is a graduate of Mater Christi Seminary and studied theology at St. Mary's Seminary, Roland Park, Baltimore. He was ordained by Bishop Scully on May 29, 1965.

Reverend Chiaramonte, known as Father Tony to his friends and parishioners, served as associate pastor at St. Mary's Church in Oneonta and in 1970 he became campus minister at SUNY Oneonta and Hartwick Colleges.

Later, he pursued graduate studies in psychology and counseling at Boston College and was awarded a Ph.D. in 1983. He served as a psychologist at the Diocesan Consultation Center in 1992 becoming its director, before retiring in 2008. Since then, he acted as Sacramental Minister at Christ Our Light Catholic Church in Loudonville.

Fr. Tony is survived by his brother Joseph (Maureen), John (Linda) and his beloved nieces and nephews, Jessica, John Chiaramonte, and Julie Sprinkle (Chad) as well as his grandniece Lucy Sprinkle and grandnephew Henry

Sprinkle.

One of Fr. Tony's most cherished affiliations was his membership at Colonie Golf and Country Club, where he had a hole in one, which was a frequent topic of conversation whenever he could find a willing or captive audience. His golfing friends gave him the unfortunate, but well deserved, nickname of the "Hoodlum Priest".

These past 48 hours have been an emotional whirlwind for our family. What should have been a joyous time for all of us has now instead been darkened by the sudden loss of someone who was an integral part of our family. Tony's humility was only matched by his great sense of humor and quick wit. His wisdom, insight, and guidance were coveted by those close to him. We are trying to find a healthy headspace while grieving. We know that in this time of sorrow we should in turn be happy for all the great memories he has gifted us throughout the years and hold onto those good feelings. We take solace in knowing he has left a lasting impact on all of the lives he touched with his love and kindness. Heaven has gained a beautiful soul.

We would be remiss if we failed to acknowledge his special friendship with Barbara LoGuidice, age 9, who struggled through a losing battle with AIDS in her far too short life.

The Rite of Reception of the Body will be celebrated on 4:00 pm on Friday, October 21, 2022 in Christ Our Light Catholic Church, Loudonville. Visitation with Fr. Tony's family will then continue until 8:00 pm. Fr. Tony's concelebrated Funeral Mass will be offered on Saturday, October 22, 2022 at 10:00 am in

Christ Our Light Catholic Church, Loudonville. The Mass can be viewed at www.youtube.com/christourlightchurchloudonville

“ Tony came to our St. Mary’s Parish in Oneonta when he was fresh out of seminary, and I was in the eighth grade. Many of us took an immediate liking to this young priest. He must have been given the assignment of “watching over the teenagers” because that’s where he began his priestly career - with us. As we graduated from St. Mary’s School and went on to Oneonta Junior High and then Senior High School, Father Tony was with us as the facilitator of our Junior Newman Club and our Catholic Youth Organization (CYO). He assisted me in getting my dream summer job as a camp counselor at Marion Lodge, which was at that time a Catholic camp for girls. Father Tony officiated my first wedding and was a present support when that marriage ended by calling to ask if I was okay and if I needed anything. Whenever I flew east to visit family in Oneonta, I would time my arriving flight in Albany so that I could have dinner with Tony. Once, when he was driving to California, he spent a night with my family in Texas before continuing on his way. In 1995, Tony celebrated Dad’s funeral Mass. He was again supportive when our son died in 2004, and during the years of 2016 - 2018 Tony was verbally supportive of my studying at One Spirit Interfaith Seminary. Recently, Father Tony drove to Oneonta once again to celebrate Mom’s funeral Mass. We spoke on a fairly regular basis - the last time just a few weeks ago. Knowing that Tony is well on the “other side” helps. However, I, like many others, miss him dearly. He was a most special person whom I loved, am grateful to have known, and will never forget. May he rest in the deep peace that he so deserves. And may you, his family, find peace during these difficult days.

“*Father Tony officiated our wedding at Christ Our Light 12 years ago; we were not parishioners but ours was a "mixed marriage" (I'm Byzantine Catholic, husband Protestant) and we were struggling with making the best choice for venue and liturgy, not to mention getting a dispensation. My father (retired psychiatric social worker) was friends with Father Tony and urged us to speak with him, particularly given his dual expertise as priest and therapist. We will always cherish his counsel: he reminded us that a marriage is not just about the couple—rather, you are marrying into each other's families because your family is an extension of yourself. He was so understanding, sympathetic, and ecumenical, reassuring us during pre-marital counseling, "We're all Christians here." He also helped us ensure both families felt included, allowing us to add a couple of Ukrainian Catholic cultural elements (crowning, common cup) into the Roman Catholic liturgy, and even graciously allowing my husband's InterVarsity Christian Fellowship minister to deliver the homily (which, as many have attested, was Father Tony's specialty!). He not only made our wedding day beautiful and special, but also laid the foundation for a successful marriage—most importantly, his counsel has guided us in thinking beyond ourselves and always striving to cultivate loving relationships with both of our families. (I'm also happy to add that our daughter was recently baptized Catholic and, after several years of working at a Catholic parish school, my husband is now preparing to convert.)
