



Sister Antoinette Nowosielski C.R.

December 24, 1932 - February 27, 2026

Castleton-On-Hudson, NY-Sister Antoinette Nowosielski, C.R., age 93 was born to eternal life on Friday, February 27, 2026 after a long illness. She died peacefully at Riverside Center for Rehabilitation and Nursing.

Sister Antoinette entered the Sisters of the Resurrection on August 31, 1946 and for the next seventy-nine years faithfully devoted her life to God as a Sister of the Resurrection.

Sister attended Fordham University where she earned a B.S. degree in Education. She continued her studies at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. Sister was a dedicated teacher and loved the little ones she taught and they loved her. From 1954 to 1982 Sister taught in schools in New York; St. Adalbert in Schenectady, St. Francis in Newburgh, and Immaculate Conception in Watervliet. From 1982 to 2020 Sister taught at St. Veronica in Howell, NJ, after which she came to our Provincialate in Castleton as a semi-retired Sister. Sister Antoinette touched countless children and families during her years of service.

Sister was born on December 24, 1932 in Albany, NY. Sister Antoinette was the daughter of Stanley and Lucy Brzozowski Nowosielski. In addition to her parents, Sister is predeceased by her two brothers, Stanley and John. She leaves behind her loving sister Mary Anne Chen and her husband Eugene as

well as many nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grandnephews.

Relatives and friends are invited to attend the visitation for Sister Antoinette at the Convent Chapel on Monday, March 2, from 2 to 5 p.m. A Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated on Tuesday, March 3, at 11:00 a.m. at the Sisters of the Resurrection Provincialate Chapel, 35 Boltwood Avenue, Castleton. Internment will be in Resurrection Cemetery, Castleton.
