Albany-Stanley J. Radzynski, 95, entered into Eternal Life Friday, May 27, 2016. Born August 4, 1920 in Albany, Stanley was employed by the Veterans Administration and the Social Security Office. He also helped his brother Frank, at the Brooks Donut Shop on Northern Blvd. in Albany.

He was a lifelong communicant of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Czestochowa, a member of the Choir Lutnia, YMS of R, Spojnia Branch 126 and held many offices on the parish committee for many years. He was a former member of the Joseph E. Zaloga Post #1520 and Polish American Citizens Club. Stanley proudly served his Country as a member of the US Army in World War II and was stationed in India. He dearly loved his family, friends, church and Country.

Stanley was the son of the late Thomas and Wladyslawa Radzynski and the stepson of the late Anna Milos Radzynski.
